July 2-5 ... Rev. George Holley

Rev. George Holley comes to us from Crown City, OH where he was the pastor of his home church, Crown City Wesleyan Church, for seventeen years. In the spring of 2002, Rev. Holley felt a new call of God

to leave the pastorate and go into full-time evangelistic service. His ministry's mission statement is to proclaim the Biblical message of holiness of heart and life to a contemporary society in a

Rev. Peter Moore joined the leadership team of Global Partners as Director of Operations in 2007. He spent his entire childhood as an MK in Zambia, Africa while his parents served as Wesleyan missionaries. After

graduating from Bethany Bible College in 1992, he completed one GP missionary term in Brisbane with the Wesleyan Methodist Church of Australia. Shortly after his return to local church

ministry in Canada on the Atlantic District, he was appointed as the District Director of Global Partners. His ten years of service in this role provided the opportunity for travel to GP mission fields on six continents.

Pastor Ken has been serving the Wesleyan Church in full time ministry for 28 years. He pastored in the Western Pennsylvania District for 16 years and is still a big Steeler fan. For the last 11 years he has been pastoring in the Chesapeake District on the

Eastern Shore of Delaware. He graduated from United Wesleyan College of Allentown, PA in 1985 and commuted to Indiana Wesleyan University from 1994-1997 for a Master of Arts degree.

Ken is currently serving as Lead Pastor at Calvary Wesleyan Church in Harrington, DE where God is moving in an awesome way. He has a passion for the Word of God and brings "the Word" with humor and conviction.



Bible Teacher ... Dr. Wilbur Williams

Dr. Williams is a professor of Biblical Literature and Archaeology at Indiana Wesleyan University in Marion, Indiana, now in his 44th year. He has published many articles as well as three books: one of poetry entitled, "From Sand to Glass," one on

the Ten Commandments entitled, "How to Find Your Maximum Happiness," and the third a commentary on the book of Genesis. He has been active on excavations in Israel and North Africa. He has dug for over 40 years in such

cities as Arad, Aphek, Jerusalem, Carthage, Lachish, Megiddo, Jezreel and Hazor. This summer he will be teaching from the books of 1 and 2 Samuel.

- Saturday afternoon we will be having a pick-up softball game. Remember to bring your glove!

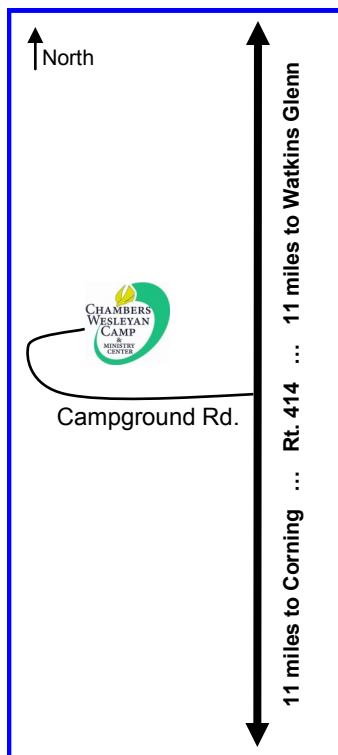
